FHS BANDS MEDICATION POLICY

The FHS Band program adheres to all FCPS policies and regulations related to the administration of medication during band-related activities. Students participating in band functions will be subject to the same rules and procedures as they would be during the normal school day. As a result, all FHS Band participants must submit an Emergency Care Form, a Medication Authorization Form (form for OTCs is required for all students, a second form for prescribed medicines should also be filled out if it is needed), an Epinephrine Authorization Form (if applicable), and an Inhaler Authorization Form (if applicable).

The Emergency Care Form (SS/SE-3, FORM #3) is the same form you will be required to provide to the school at the start of the academic year, so you may wish to make copies for your future use.

The Medication Authorization Form for OTCs (FORM #5) included in this packet has been prepopulated with over-the-counter medications the band typically carries and will administer on band trips if needed (such as Away Band Camp, marching competitions, etc). **PLEASE CROSS OUT** any medications you **DO NOT WANT** your child to receive. Only a parent signature is required on the OTC medication form.

IMPORTANT: It is CRITICAL that we receive a copy of the OTC Medication Authorization form for EVERY student participating in marching band, so if you do not wish your child to receive ANY medications, please cross out ALL the listed medications, write, "DO NOT ADMINISTER ANY MEDICATIONS" and return the signed form.

In addition, if your child requires any PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION, please use the blank copy of the Medication Authorization Form (FORM #6) included in this packet. A parent signature is sufficient if the prescription is an antibiotic or antiviral medication. Administration of prescription medication other than antibiotics or antivirals by the band program requires that your child's physician complete Part II of the Medication Authorization form. Please note: many physicians will require an appointment in order to complete this form, so leave yourself adequate time to have the form completed PRIOR to August 7. In addition, this is the same form you will need for the start of the school year, so you might consider getting a blank form signed at the same time you get your band form completed, so that you can provide this form to the clinic at FHS. A blank copy of the form can be obtained at http://www.fcps.edu/it/forms/se63.pdf.

If your child carries an Epi-pen and/or a rescue inhaler, please complete the appropriate form(s) (Epinephrine Authorization FORM #7 and/or Inhaler Authorization FORM #8), have your physician complete it, and return it to the band program by August 15. Please use the appropriate form, rather than adding an Epi-pen or inhaler to the generic Medication Authorization, as the specialized forms are written to permit students to carry Epi-pens and inhalers during the day. Please note: many physicians will require an appointment in order to complete these forms, so leave yourself adequate time to have the forms completed PRIOR to August 7. In addition, these are the same forms you will need for the start of the school year, so you might wish to consider getting a blank or forms signed at the same time you get your band form(s) completed, so that you can provide these forms to the clinic at FHS. A blank copy of the forms can be obtained at http://www.fcps.edu/it/forms/se65.pdf (Inhaler). Scroll to the bottom of the page for the forms.

The band will travel with a supply of the over-the-counter medications listed on the Medication Authorization form (e.g., acetaminophen, ibuprofen, antihistamine) should your child need them. ALL medication (prescription and OTC), with the exception of Epi-pens and rescue inhalers, MUST be in the possession of an FCPS employee for the duration of all band trips.

Please refer to the Sample Medication Authorization Form included in the packet, and contact Band Booster President, Jaimee Nygaard, or Band Director, Dr. Jeff Lehman, if you have any questions or concerns regarding completion of these forms.

We are encouraging ALL marching band students to have a Pre-Participation physical performed prior to the start of the school year and the results submitted to the Athletic Trainers office at FHS. This is not the same as a well-child physical exam. This way all Marching Rebels will be eligible for treatment by the athletic training staff at school should any injuries occur during practice or a game. CHARMS

Charms is an online, comprehensive music program management system.

As Charms is used as the main band communications tool, please make sure to include student and parent(s) email addresses and cell phone numbers. You can also update your contact information.

If you have not already done so, PLEASE log in and update your personal info! Per FHS, the Charms system may not be active at the beginning of band camp – the weekly Band newsletter will report Charms status.

PAYMENT

Payment for fees has changed this year we will be using My School Bucks to pay all fees.

If it is not visible on the first screen, click the NEXT button until you see the icon/item. Click on VIEW DETAILS and follow the payment steps from there.

Marching Band Pre-Season is not eligible for any fee waivers, but all of the other fees are. Please contact Dr. Lehman for further instructions on how to apply your waiver, otherwise full payment is expected.

ATTENDANCE AND GRADING POLICIES

The FHS Bands grading policy is outlined in the FHS Bands Student Handbook, which will be distributed to students on the first day of school. Although marching band rehearsal is conducted outside of the school day, it is considered an extension of the classroom and thus, Marching Rebels members are covered by this grading policy. A large portion of a student's individual band grade is based on attendance. It is expected that every student will be prepared technically and mentally for each performance. The primary focus of daily rehearsals is to prepare for performance; therefore, the penalty for an unexcused absence from a performance will be significant and appropriate. Each musical organization's performance is judged by our school, community, our families, and in the case of competitions, judges. One person's absence affects the entire ensemble's performance. The schedule of rehearsals and performances has been published in advance – take care of problems and conflicts BEFORE they happen!

EXCUSED ABSENCES

In order for a student to be excused from a rehearsal or a performance, a note or phone call from a parent/guardian must be received, reviewed and approved by the Director as soon as the student becomes aware of the conflict. In the case of an unavoidable emergency, a note or phone call must be received on the student's first day back to school or rehearsal. Timely notification of potential conflicts allows the Director to make adjustments to the ensemble so that the programs (and other students!) are not negatively affected. The schedule of rehearsals and performances has been published in advance – take care of problems and conflicts BEFORE they happen! Work schedules, other non-school activities, and family vacations are not acceptable reasons for missing a rehearsal or a performance. If you are participating in other FHS clubs or sports, **ask for a complete semester calendar** for all your activities so that you have the maximum amount of time to identify and resolve potential conflicts. The only excuses that will be accepted for a missed rehearsal or performance will be those involving unavoidable emergencies and sickness.

DISCIPLINE

Discipline is a quality that must come from within the individual, and as such, each student is responsible for his/her own actions as a member of the FHS Bands. Fairfax High School and Fairfax County Public Schools policies govern the FHS Bands at all band functions and events. Any student that violates school rules while participating with the FHS Bands will be subject to all official school disciplinary action. In addition, students who violate school rules and/or band policies may be **subject to dismissal** and will **not** continue to perform or travel with the band.

REHEARSALS

Rehearsals will always **begin** at their stated time. It is the responsibility of each student to arrive at rehearsal early enough to assemble his/her instrument, gather the necessary equipment needed for the day's rehearsal, and report to the marching field. Arriving to rehearsal 10 minutes early is a good habit that will always ensure that students are ready for the beginning of each rehearsal and will make the best use of our valuable rehearsal time. Likewise, rehearsals will **end** promptly at the stated time.

PERFORMANCES

Whether performing at an FHS football game or at a marching band competition, Marching Rebels members are expected to conduct themselves as ambassadors not only for FHS Bands, but for Fairfax High School and the larger Fairfax community as well. It is important to understand that the behavior of each student, while attending an event or performing as a member of the FHS Marching Rebels, reflects upon the entire organization.

During football games, it is the job of the band to support the team (no matter the score!) and keep the crowd involved in the game. The band will play throughout the game – our performance does not end after halftime. Students are expected to remain with the band throughout the entire game, and only band members are allowed to sit with the band. If you must leave the stands to go to the restroom, please ask an adult for permission so that we know where everyone is at all times.

UNIFORMS

A great deal of pride, responsibility, and respect accompanies the wearing of the FHS Marching Rebels uniform and Color Guard Costume. All members are expected to wear the uniform or costume with pride at all times. Whenever you are in uniform or costume and/or with the band, you represent not only yourself but your family, your band, and your school.

Each member is responsible for the proper care of the uniform or costume throughout the season. Damage to the uniform or costume and/or lost pieces becomes the financial responsibility of the student to which it was issued. Marching band uniforms and costumes are expensive to replace – please take care of it and do not place it in a situation where it may become dirty, damaged or lost. **The Marching Rebel student and parent must review, complete and return the uniform or costume agreement**, and address any questions to the Boosters or Dr. Lehman.

While in band uniform, the FHS Marching Rebels will abide by an "all or nothing" policy. Simply put, you are either in full uniform or you are not in any of it. The band uniform will be worn in its entirety while in public – students may only remove portions of the uniform (hats, jackets, gloves) when told to do so by the Director. Jackets, when worn, must always be completely zipped. The 2017 FHS marching band t-shirt is to be worn underneath the uniform jacket as part of the uniform.

While in uniform or costume, Marching Rebels members may not chew gum or eat and drink (other than water) without the permission of the Director. **No visible jewelry, earrings, excessive makeup, or fingernail polish** (both males and females) may be worn while in uniform with the exception of color guard members, who may wear face makeup. Long hair (both males and females) must be pulled back and kept up where it will not be visible outside of the band uniform hat.

The uniform or costume will remain in the FHS uniform room when it is not being used by the student (i.e., off season). In addition to the 2017 FHS marching band t-shirt, each band member (not including color guard) must provide the following items as part of the uniform:

- Clean BLACK socks, no patterns, all black. Socks must come above the ankle.
- BLACK Drillmaster marching shoes. These shoes have a lifetime guarantee and should last the student for his/her entire tenure as a member of the FHS Marching Rebels. These shoes can be purchased from the FHS Band Boosters at cost for \$33.50 and are required for all Marching Rebels members (except color guard).
- Black cotton gloves. Members will be issued one pair of black gloves as part of the uniform. If gloves become soiled, dirty, or lost, additional pairs of gloves can be purchased from the FHS Band Boosters for \$3.

At the end of the season, each member will be responsible for returning the uniform or costume and all of its pieces to the FHS band uniform room after the last marching band event. Students must return all pieces of the uniform or costume that they were originally issued and will be financially responsible for items that are damaged beyond repair and/or lost.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR BAND UNIFORM CARE – PLEASE READ! (not applicable for color guard)

Our marching uniforms have highly specialized care instructions for dry cleaning, and several parts of the uniform are designed not to be cleaned. Should your uniform become dirty or soiled during the course of the season, please see Dr. Lehman or our uniform chairperson to get a copy of the cleaning instructions before you go to the dry cleaners. Any uniform that has been cleaned incorrectly and is damaged will be replaced at the expense of the student to which it was issued.

The preferred cleaner is Young's Cleaners. They are located at 10782-F Fairfax Blvd.

AUGUST REHEARSALS ("BAND CAMP")

- August rehearsals begin for color guard, percussion members, and section leaders on July 31.
- August rehearsals begin for rookies on August 2-4.
- . August rehearsals begin for veteran marchers on August 7.

These rehearsals are required and attendance policies and regulations concerning excused absences will be in effect. These August rehearsals are the foundation for which we will base our **entire** 2017 season, and their importance cannot be overstated.

BAND PICTURE

The band group picture and individual student pictures are scheduled by the Athletic Department to be taken in the stadium during band camp. If you wish to purchase the professionally produced band photo and/or an individual photo of your Marching Rebel in uniform or costume, you will need to submit a completed order form and payment by check on the morning of the pictures. Forms are typically provided ahead of time, and can also be filled out that morning. We will endeavor to have the forms available in time for the New Parent

meeting and/or the first day of returning marchers' camp or as soon as we receive them from the Athletic Department.

ATTIRE

During August rehearsals, all students are expected to wear appropriate marching or color guard attire. Acceptable footwear is athletic shoes with socks. Sandals, flip-flops, Crocs, boots, and dress shoes are not appropriate for marching or color guard and may cause injury to the student. Students without proper footwear will not be able to participate in marching or color guard rehearsals until the problem is resolved (this holds true for after school marching rehearsals starting in September as well – please plan ahead).

In addition, students should anticipate and dress appropriately for hot, humid weather. Light colored, loose fitting shorts are **highly** recommended. **White t-shirts are required for all participants during band camp**; tank tops and other sleeveless shirts may seem cooler but actually cause students to become more susceptible to heat because more of their body is exposed to the sun. Hats, sunglasses and **SUNSCREEN** should be worn to protect students from the heat and the sun's rays. Please take care of yourself and do not allow yourself to become sunburned!

In the case of inclement or severe weather, rehearsals will be moved indoors to the FHS band room or hallways. In the case of light rain, have rain gear and be prepared to march or rehearse outside – we have an extremely limited amount of time in which to learn portions of the field show in time for the first football game. At NO TIME will the safety of the band be jeopardized on the account of weather; rehearsals will be brought indoors whenever outdoor rehearsals are considered to be dangerous due to weather conditions.

MEALS

Lunches are NOT provided during August rehearsals at school; students are expected to provide their own lunches each day. It is recommended that students bring their own lunches rather than trying to run out to grab fast food during the lunch break – students who leave FHS during the lunch break do so at their own risk. Long fast food lines and/or bad traffic will not be acceptable excuses for arriving late to afternoon rehearsals; please plan accordingly.

WATER is perhaps the most important aspect to maintaining good health during band camp. Although we will have water available on the marching field during August rehearsals, each marching band member is expected to bring his/her **own large water bottle** to the rehearsal field each day. During short water breaks, students will not have enough time to run into the school for water – please bring it with you. In addition, please take care to limit your intake of carbonated beverages and sodas during August rehearsals, as these drinks will dehydrate you and make you more susceptible to the heat. We are also asking students to be diligent in keeping their water bottles with them during the away camp, as the band is trying to reduce the quantity of disposable paper cups it uses.

EQUIPMENT

All students are required to have their instrument or flags in good working order for all rehearsals and performances. In addition to having a well-maintained instrument and mouthpiece, each student is expected to have the following equipment at every marching rehearsal:

- Woodwinds will be supplied two plastic reeds in an effort to generate more sound. The two reeds should easily last the entire season. However, they may not arrive by the beginning of band camp. Woodwinds are responsible for all wooden reeds, cork grease and swabs.
- Brass players must have valve and slide oil; trombones should have slide cream and water bottles.
- Drum line members must have two pairs of matching, taped marching percussion sticks. Heads must be kept in good playing condition and all percussion equipment must be put away after each use.
- Color guard members must have all practice flags, gloves, poles and other auxiliary equipment.

In addition to the above, all brass and wind players are required to purchase a flip folder and lyre appropriate for your instrument. These can be easily purchased at a local music store. Although show music will be memorized, flip folders are required for stands tunes during all home football games. If possible, consider buying all-metal lyres instead of plastic lyres (plastic lyres are more susceptible to breakage and will need to be replaced if they break before the season is over).

ALL FHS Marching Rebels members are expected to have their music with them at every rehearsal (even if it is already memorized). Each student is also required to have a pencil at every rehearsal so that changes can be marked into their music – music is never to be marked with a pen (pencil only!)

School instruments are available to any student who does not have his/her own instrument. In the event of damage to a school instrument, the Director must be informed as soon as possible. Damage to an instrument that is the result of negligence or carelessness of the student will become the financial responsibility of the student to which that instrument was issued.

MUSIC MEMORIZATION (not applicable to color guard)

The field show music must be memorized by all Marching Rebels members. All of these pieces will be made available on the below Google drive well before the beginning of camp, and all titles MUST be memorized by the first day of band camp for all (August 7). If you need help memorizing your music, you may talk with your section leader, a drum major, or the Band Director.

The FHS Fight Song, the National Anthem, and other chants, cheers, and stands tunes played during fall football games will be put into a flip folder and will not have to be memorized. These pieces will be given out to students during August band camp.

FUNDRAISERS

Our first fundraiser of the season is a Car Wash scheduled for Saturday, August 12, 2017, 9am-3pm. Students will be assigned two hour shifts by the MB student leaders during band camp. Parent volunteers are needed throughout the day to supervise the car wash. Parents please contact Susan Smullen, FHS Band Booster VP of Volunteers, if you are able to assist with the car wash and/or anything else throughout the year – we can't do what we do without YOU!

Attendance at the August 12th Car Wash is expected of **ALL** FHS Marching Rebels members; the more students we have work the car wash, the more money we make. The FHS Band Boosters provide almost all of the financial support necessary to operate ALL of the FHS ensembles. The Boosters depend on fundraisers such as this one to help support our band and keep our band fees amongst the lowest in Fairfax County. Should the August 12th date need to be cancelled due to inclement weather, an email will be sent informing all of the cancellation. Last year we raised about \$2,000.00.

The band's major fundraiser of the year is **Tag Day**. This year it will be held on Saturday, September 9, 2017 from 8:00 a.m. until approximately 4:00 p.m. **All band members are expected to take part in this important event which raised \$24,000 last year!**

PARENT VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Volunteers of all abilities are needed for all FHS bands to have a successful season! Regardless of whether you may be able to volunteer for various events, there are still simple and easy ways in which you can support the FHS Bands and the Marching Rebels:
